- Improved accuracy
 - Quicker to process (scan or capture data) goods/items

 - Easy to track stock levels (if linked to a stock system) etc. (2)

- Provides more space (no keyboard)
 - Ideal for restaurants/fast-food outlets with a standard/fixed set of options
 - Users have a feeling of 'intimacy/immediacy' interacting with device/data
 - Intuitive to use
 - Can use hand gestures e.g. 'swiping' etc. (2)

- 4.1.1 Memory holds the programs and data that are being processed. ✓
Storage keeps data and programs permanently (even when the power is switched off). ✓ (2)
- 4.1.2 Any TWO of: ✓✓
- Memory is faster than storage
 - Memory is more expensive than storage (per unit)
 - Memory is volatile / needs power to retain its contents
- (Do not accept any answer relating to the difference in function between them.)* (2)
- 4.2.1 A driver is software ✓ that is used to control a specific hardware device. ✓ (2)
- 4.2.2 No ✓
Although most devices are automatically detected and the drivers are automatically installed, you still need the drivers.
(Do not award mark for 'No' if no motivation is given.) ✓ (2)
- 4.3 Any TWO of: ✓✓
- Emptying Recycle Bin
 - Removing temporary files from Internet
 - Removing temporary files created by operating system / Windows
 - Uninstalling components of the operating system not needed
 - Uninstalling programs you never use (2)

- 4.4.1 Disk fragmentation is a process that occurs whereby different parts of the files can become scattered across the disk. ✓
This can cause the computer to become slower in retrieving the files in order to open or save them. ✓ (2)
- 4.4.2 The 'scattered' parts of files on disk are rearranged and consolidated so that they can be retrieved more quickly. ✓
The same 'volume' of data is still being stored on disk so no 'more disk space' is being made available. ✓ (2)

- Easy to use/plugs into a USB port
 - Highly portable
 - Newer external hard drives have large capacities
 - Can store backup (drive) off-site for safety etc. (2)
- 4.8 Backing up files means making a duplicate copy of the files (on external storage). ✓
Archiving files means removing /cutting seldom used files, or files that won't be changed, from the computer and writing them to external storage. ✓ (2)

 - Posting administrative/policy documents

- 5.6.1 An AUP is a policy document that outlines the rights/privileges/responsibilities of a user in terms of the usage of computer facilities. ✓ (1)

- Privacy issues

Question 6

- 6.1.1 A primary key is a field that has unique/different value in that field for every record. / A field that uniquely identifies a record. ✓
The *CellNo* field is the only field that can serve as a primary key. ✓
(Do not accept *Email* field as a primary key as some entries are blank.). (2)
- 6.1.2 Criteria for *Grade* field should be 11 or 12 ✓ (accept ≥ 11)
Criteria for *WhatsApp* field should 'move 1 line up'
(accept description where all criteria are repeated) ✓
No sorting is specified. ✓
The Surname and Name fields need to have their 'Show' properties selected/ticked. ✓ (4)
- 6.2 Add section breaks before and after the page ✓
and change the page orientation of that section to landscape. ✓
(Also accept highlighting text and applying landscape format to selected text.) (2)
- 6.3.1 A text editor. ✓
(Accept specific examples such as *WordPad* or *Notepad*). (1)
- 6.3.2 All formatting would be lost. ✓ (1)
- 6.3.3 Any ONE of: ✓
- It is easier to maintain consistency in terms of formatting.
 - It saves time as a number of formatting actions or options can be applied in one go.
 - It is easy to effect changes to styles globally throughout the document, etc. (1)

- 7.1.3 15.6" ✓ (HD LED)
Small screen is indicative of a portable computer. ✓ (2)
- 7.2 Any THREE of: ✓✓✓
- Speed
 - Resolution
 - Monthly Duty Cycle
 - Number of colours
 - Paper options etc.
- (Do not accept cost, brand names and warranties.) (3)
- 7.3 PDF is a type of file format. ✓
Any ONE benefit: ✓
- Do not require the program in which the document was created to read it.
 - User cannot generally change the document.
 - Usually create smaller file sizes than original file. (2)
- 7.4 Any TWO of: ✓✓
- Eye tracking devices
 - Head movement devices
 - Large key (outsize) keyboards
 - Large trackballs
 - Joysticks
 - Foot pedal control devices
 - Sip and puff devices (2)
- 7.5.1 Any TWO of: ✓✓ (2)
- Hardware such as printers can be shared – cost saving
 - Software can be shared
 - Files are stored on a central computer (file server) allowing users access from any computer in the network.
 - Files can be transferred very easily without the use of devices such as portable hard drives.
 - Easier to maintain security.
 - A single Internet connection can be shared by all users, etc.
- 7.5.2 A NIC is a controller/card ✓
used to connect the computer to the network /
controls the communication between the computer and the network. ✓
A switch is a network device used to connect computers to a central point ✓ so that
communication can occur. ✓ (4)
- 7.5.3 Any TWO of: ✓✓
- Security can be compromised if the WLAN is not configured correctly
 - Signal could get lost or interfered with due to electronic or electrical interference
 - Performance can decrease as the number of computers connected increases.

- Extra cost of wireless NICs and wireless access points
- Require more expertise to set up, etc. (2)

7.6.1 Now it prevents sorting/filtering on surname. ✓ (1)

7.6.2 Monthly Salary values have been **formatted** to zero decimals / The cents are not displayed but stored in the cell and used by *Excel* when calculating the total ✓
 Rather use the Round function to round the Monthly Salary values if you only want to work with whole numbers . ✓ (2)

7.6.3 Those with a monthly salary of less than R 5000 pay no tax. ✓
 The others pay tax of R 1000 ✓ plus a percentage of ✓ the amount they earn over R 5000 ✓ (4)

7.6.4 Absolute addressing is used to prevent cell references changing ✓ when a formula is copied to other cells. ✓
 In this case the C4 cell reference needs to be made absolute ✓ (D\$1 or \$D\$1). (3)

- Saves space on local computer
- Backups are stored safely off-site
- Can access files/data wherever you have Internet access
- Certain amount of storage is provided for free (2)

- Need Internet access
- Pay for storage and You pay for the data storage and the bandwidth (costs) used to upload and download the data.
- Privacy/security concerns
- Concerns if company goes out of business etc. (2)
